The Youth Program grew from the former

Maternity program. We have 10 spots for

youth. The girls are pregnant, or are learning

parenting skills, or are considered high risk

due to experiencing human trafficking or prostitution, drugs, or gang related activities.

The other program is our Child Care Centre

where we house 0-4 year olds who have been

apprehended by Social Services. These

placements are to be temporary but we have

had some children up to a year.

weekends. From babies to teenagers our

residents can use extra hugs and friendship.

Our goal is to bring the love of Jesus to our

residents as we meet their needs. As we are
